HOBART 25 September: Estimated final cost of the new Tasman Bridge over the River Derwent, officially opened last year, has risen to ₹ 7,370,572 - about ₹3,000,000 more than the original estimate. SYDNEY 25 September: The NSW Govt, would sell or lease at least 10,000 home building blocks to the public within the next 5 years, Premier Askin said today. CAMBERRA 27 September: A new squadron would be formed at RAAF Base Richmond to handle new Hercules aircraft when they arrived in Australia next year, the Air Hinister said today. SYDNEY September 28: Hundreds of firefighters are operating on three fronts trying to prevent a bushfire diaster in the Blue Hountains. There are major fires at Glenbrook, and North Springwood and many fires. The NSW Govt. has placed most of the NSW Coast under a total fire VICTORIA 28 September: GMH tonight put off an additional 1046 workers, making smaller fires. 1,944 stood down at all Gill plants since the beginning of the month. A company official said this was caused by the severe general decline in the market for new HODART 28 September: A 93 mph gale hit Hobart last night and early today, unroofing houses and service stations, uprooting trees and blowing yachts on to the rocks on the harbour foreshores. MELBOURNE 29 September: The estimated cost of repairing Kings Bridge was \$1,004,000, the Minister for Public Works told the Vic. Legislative Assembly today. AMBERLEY 30 September: Australian, New Zealand and USAF bombers from Amberley RAAF Base will try to "destroy" Sydney on October 11 and 12, in a joint operational exercise. SYDNEY 1 October: Wholesale prices of food and tobacco rose by 4.2% during August, the Australian Bureau of Statistics reported. INELBOURNE 1 October: The Melbourne Cup this year will be started for the first time by a member of the Federal Parliament. MELBOURNE 2 October: A surgical team from St Vincents Hospital left Melbourne today by air for Sth Vietnam. A 2nd team will leave later this month. Both will work in the Long Xuyen Hospital on the southern branch of the Mekong River. BALIARAT 3 October: A 1930 Australian penny was sold today at a coin auction, for the world record price of #230. MELBOURNE 3 Oct: Ansett-ANA and TAA are to introduce Boeing 727 jetliners on their night services between Perth WA and Melbourne this nonth.


